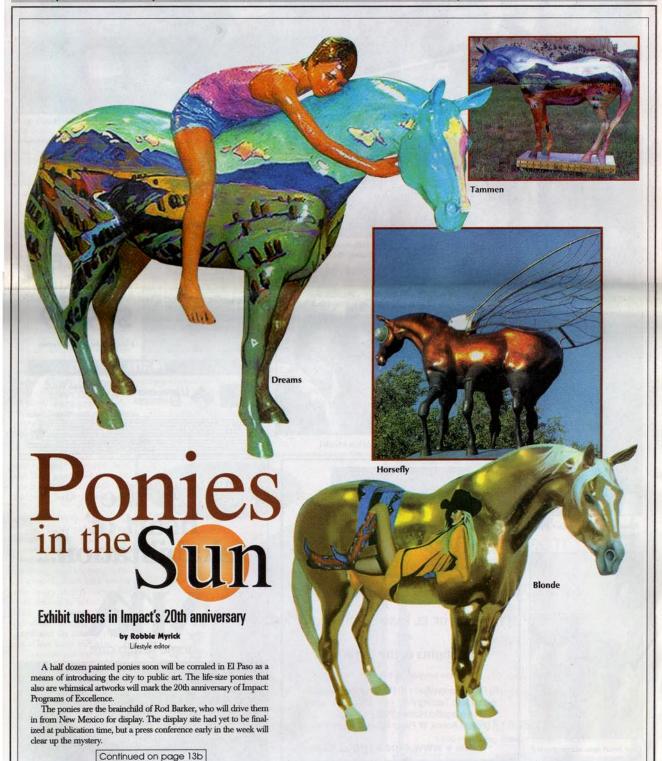

Whatever site finally is selected will be host to seven horses from the "Trail of Painted Ponies" public art extravaganza.

It follows the theme of animal art projects elsewhere: pigs in Cincinnati, fish in New Orleans, cows in Chicago and Potatoheads in Rhode Island. Los Angeles adjusted its public art project to focus on angels.

Barker selected the ponies to be shown in El Paso to fit the landscape and to support the public art concept that Norma Geller and Sally Gilbert have selected to mark the anniversary of Impact: Programs of Excellence.

"Art and Soul" is what they have called their project that will invite artists to create images of the sun. Designs will begin being accepted March 15 for projects that are to reflect music, literature, mythology, history and science that reference the

Designs will be judged by a committee of educators and the final artworks will be on exhibit throughout the city.

## Introduction

The "Painted Ponies" will offer an education into public art and Barker said he will be talking to an unnamed artist about creating a new pony to be titled, "Stary, Starry Nightmare."

He said he purposes to work with artists from Arizona, Texas and New Mexico to tie in sup-

"I'm doing a creative sequel next to grow on that success and will add a running horse form to be done by regional artists," Barker said, in call from Scottsdale, Ariz.

He said he was glad to drive down a herd of painted ponies to support the Impact anniver-

sary project.
"They have a terrific concept. A lot of these projects aren't guaranteed success because it requires the right timing and vision and Sally and Norma have been professionals doing their homework and preparing," he said.

Barker said the two Impact founders spent time with him in New Mexico and asked plenty of questions, studying public art failures elsewhere to ensure suc-

He said he also plans on



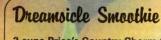
some reciprocation and is planning to exhibit some of the final artworks in the "Art & Soul" project in New Mexico.
